



'Pick and Mix' Homework

Choose **at least two items** to complete and bring into school for the 'Homework Celebration' event for children and parents on **Tuesday 19th March from 2.30pm. Homework can be brought into school from Monday 18th March.**

1. Art:

We've been exploring primary and secondary colours this term and exploring the work of Vassily Kandinsky. Create your own piece of artwork in the style of Kandinsky, remember you can mix your own colours and shades.



2. Science:

We've been learning about different materials and using scientific words to describe their properties e.g. rough, transparent. Make a collage using lots of different materials and textures. Can you label the materials you've used or their properties?



3. Art/DT:

We've been learning about penguins, make your own 3D penguin, you could use dough, clay, junk materials.



4. Geography:

Make a picture or poster about one of the 7 continents of the world we have learnt about at school. Think about the different countries in that continent, famous landmarks, food or animals that live there.

5. Science/geography:

Go for a walk and see if you can spot any signs that Spring is on the way. Take photographs or draw pictures of what you see.



6. English: Class 1 have been enjoying our new poetry corner, reading, creating and reciting the poems we have learnt. Write a poem to add to our Class poetry book. Maybe you could write a poem about a penguin. Remember a poem doesn't need to rhyme.
